## **Project Description**

The Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT) in coordination with the Federal Highway Administration has initiated a project to realign SR 79 along County Road 278 / Petersburg Road to SR 43 east of the City of Lincolnton.


SR 79 serves as a commuter route between the City of Elberton and the City of Lincolnton. It is currently functionally classified as a Minor Arterial. The existing roadway is comprised of one 12-ft. travel lane in each direction with 6-ft. rural shoulders each side. The horizontal alignment meanders with vertical grades of 1% -7%. The land use along this route is a mixture of residential developments, lake properties, planted pines and hardwood timber outcroppings. The existing R/W along SR 79 is 100-ft. (50-ft. each side of the centerline). There will be additional right of way required from SR 79 that varies in width from 0-ft. to 20-ft. The traffic along SR 79 is comprised of lightweight vehicles, tractor-trailers, school buses and emergency vehicles. The posted speed along this portion of SR 79 is 55 MPH.

CR 278 / Petersburg Road serves as a commuter route for local traffic to access SR 43 and SR 79. It is currently functionally classified as a Local Road. The existing roadway is comprised of one 10-ft. travel lane in each direction with 2-ft. to 4-ft. rural shoulders each side. The horizontal alignment is poor and meanders with vertical grades of 1% - 7%. The land use along this route is a mixture of residential developments, industrial developments, churches and planted pines and hardwood timber outcroppings. The existing RW along CR 278 is 80-ft. (40-ft. each side of the centerline). There will be additional right of way required from CR 278 that varies in width from 0-ft. to 20-ft with additional widths out to 90-ft. required around drainage structures. The traffic along CR 278 is comprised of lightweight vehicles, school buses and emergency vehicles. The posted speed along this portion of CR 278 is not posted but will be posted 45 MPH with this project.

SR 43 serves as a main roadway from the City of Lincolnton to the Georgia – South Carolina State Line. It is currently functionally classified as a Minor Arterial. The existing roadway is comprised of one 12-ft. travel lane in each direction with 6-ft. rural shoulders each side. The horizontal alignment meanders with vertical grades of 1% - 3%. The land use along this route is a mixture of residential developments, lake properties, educational facilities and planted pines and hardwood timber outcroppings. The existing RW along SR 43 is 130-ft. (65-ft. each side of the centerline). A triangular shaped piece of RW will be required in the northwest quadrant of the intersection with CR 278. The traffic along SR 43 is comprised of lightweight vehicles, tractor-trailers, school buses and emergency vehicles. The posted speed along this portion of SR 43 is 55 MPH.

Currently, SR 79 enters the City of Lincolnton to SR 43 near the downtown section of the city. This area is comprised of historic districts with narrow streets and historic buildings located close to the existing roadways. This makes navigation very difficult for the trucks passing through the city along SR 79. The need exists to provide an alternative truck route on the east side of the City of Lincolnton that will allow trucks to use SR 79 to gain access to SR 43 and SR 47 on the southeast side of the City of Lincolnton. By re-routing SR 79 along CR 278 to SR 43, a new truck route will be established which will connect SR 79 to SR 43 and SR 47 connector, allowing the truck traffic to by-pass the City of Lincolnton and thereby relieving the congestion inside the city limits.

CR 278 will be closed for approximately 6 months to through traffic during construction. Local residents will continue to have maintained access.
