

## STP00-0001-00(939), Jasper County P.I. No. 0001939 Northeast Monticello Bypass

## **Project Description**

The proposed project consists of the construction of a northeast truck route bypass around the city of Monticello, Georgia beginning just south of the SR 380 intersection with SR 16 and continuing north and east on new location to SR 83 (see **Figure 1A**, Project Location Map). Total project length is approximately 3.45 miles. The proposed truck route bypass typical section would consist of two 12-foot travel lanes (one lane in each direction) with 8-foot rural shoulders (4-foot paved) on approximately 120 to 200 feet of proposed right-of-way. Two bridges are proposed over White Oak Creek and the Norfolk Southern Railroad. The proposed bridge over White Oak Creek would be approximately 260 feet in length by 40 feet wide. The proposed bridge over the Norfolk Southern Railroad would be approximately 188 feet in length by 40 feet wide. The proposed speed design is 55 miles per hour (MPH) and access will be by permit. Traffic will be maintained along the existing roadway network during project construction.
