CRISP MILITARY HIGHWAY — DESIGNATED.

A RESOLUTION

To provide that the highways known as the U. S. Routes No. 80 and No. 280, which begin at Savannah Beach, Chatham County, on the Atlantic Ocean, thence to Savannah, McRae, Cordele, and Americus, and terminates at Columbus, connecting the greatest military reservation in the United States, Fort Benning, with the great seacoast fortification known as Fort Screven, Savannah Beach, shall be known and designated and maintained as the "Crisp Military Highway."

BE IT RESOLVED by the General Assembly of Georgia:

Section 1

That the highway known as U.S. Highway No. 80 and 280 as indicated above, extending from Savannah Beach through the Cities of Savannah, McRae, Cordele, and Americus, terminating at the City of Columbus in Muscogee County, shall hereafter be known, designated, and maintained as the "Crisp Military Highway."

[Sidenote: Route of Crisp Military Highway.]

Section 2

That the State Highway Board is hereby directed to so designate and maintain Federal Routes No. 80 and No. 280, herein described, as the "Crisp Military Highway" in conformity with the laws relating to such highways.
