

A RESOLUTION BY THE STATE HIGHWAY BOARD OF GEORGIA 1962

THE BILL KEY BRIDGE — DESIGNATED.

WHEREAS, in this State there has not been a more interested and active supporter of better roads being obtained throughout the State than is Honorable William Hicks Key of Jasper County, and

WHEREAS, over a span of some 34 years he has served as Representative of the County of Jasper, or as Senator from his district, in the General Assembly of the State, and during these periods of service he was actively working in creating and perfecting the resolutions and acts which have served to develop an efficient State Highway Department with generous financial resources and legal powers to function successfully, as well as to diligently labor in other and varied efforts and actions in the best interests of all people of his State, and

WHEREAS, such sustained and well directed efforts have been necessary to enable the State to prosper and grow and to improve the thousands of miles of good roads needed by its people, and

WHEREAS, the State Highway Department through the State Highway Board wishes to record its appreciation for his fine services and to express its thanks to Honorable William Hicks Key, affectionately known as "Bill Key," for his support and encouragement over the years, and

WHEREAS, this appreciation can best be commemorated in enduring fashion by naming in his honor the bridge structure over the Ocmulgee River which bridge is a part of the road serving his home county and city extending between Monticello and Forsyth.

THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by this Board that the bridge over the Ocmulgee River at the county line between Monroe and Jasper Counties on State Highway 83 be, and the same is, hereby named "The Bill Key Bridge."

It is directed that copy of this resolution be furnished to Mr. Key, and that copies be sent to the Boards of Commissioners of Monroe and Jasper Counties.
