Thank you for attending the public information open house for NHS00-0000-00(762), P.I. No. 0000762, the proposed reconstruction and widening of SR 7 (Shiloh Road/ N Valdosta Road), Exit 22 and SR 122 (Main Street), Exit 29 and their interchanges with I-75. In this handout package you will find a project description, location maps, and comment card.

Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT) representatives, who can be identified by the nametags they are wearing, are available to discuss the project and answer your questions. Comments can also be made via the web at www.dot.ga.gov. Click on Public Outreach from the Information Center dropdown menu at the top right side of the page. All comments will be made a part of the project record. We hope you will take advantage of one of these opportunities to let GDOT know your view of the proposal.

The displays and plans will be available for review for ten days after the public information open house at the Georgia Department of Transportation Valdosta Area Office located at 1411 Madison Highway, Valdosta, Georgia 31601. Copies of these displays will also be located at the Georgia Department of Transportation District 4 Office located at 710 W. 2nd Street, Tifton, Georgia, 31794. A copy of all comments received will be available for public review at this same location and at the Georgia Department of Transportation, Office of Environment Services, 600 West Peachtree Street NW, 16th Floor, Atlanta, Georgia 30308, as soon as compilation is completed.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Georgia Department of Transportation Project NHS00-0000-00(762) Lowndes County P.I. No. 0000762

Project NHS00-0000-00(762) is a proposal to widen 1.0 miles of SR 7 (Shiloh Road/N Valdosta Road) and 0.7 miles of SR 122 (Main Street) and reconstruct their interchanges with I-75.


Interstate 75/ Shiloh Road/ SR 7 (North Valdosta Road) Interchange- Exit 22

The I-75/ Shiloh Road/ SR 7 (North Valdosta Road) interchange reconstruction begins on Shiloh Road just east of the Frank's Creek bridge. With proposed improvements, the existing two-lane Shiloh Road would transition to and become a four-lane divided roadway with a 20-foot raised concrete median and rural 6 1/2-foot outside paved shoulders. The existing I-75 southbound on and off-ramps constructed under Project NH 75-1(203), P.I. No. 410500 would be tied to the proposed SR 7 improvements. The project would include a new bridge over I-75 and reconstruct the I-75 northbound on and off-ramps. The existing SR 7 median opening at Flythe Road would be closed. A proposed SR 7 median opening would be constructed at Northlake Drive approximately 280 feet to the east and Flythe Road would be relocated as the fourth leg of the intersection. The I-75/SR 7 interchange reconstruction on SR 7 (N. Valdosta Road) ends just east of the existing signalized intersection at Coleman Road (CR 553). The project would tie to the existing four-lane divided rural roadway with a forty-foot depressed grass median. Existing right of way is 80 to 200 feet on SR 7 and 300 to 1325 feet within the I-75 interchange. Proposed right of way is 160 to 200 feet on SR 7 and 300 to 1425 feet within the I-75 interchange.

Interstate 75/SR 122 (Main Street) Interchange-Exit 29

The I-75/SR 122 (Main Street) Interchange reconstruction begins on SR 122 just east of the Frank's Creek bridge. With proposed improvements, the existing two-lane SR 122 would transition to and become two eastbound lanes and one westbound lane separated by a variable flush median with rural 6 1/2-foot outside paved shoulders approaching the intersection of the relocated Morven Road and a proposed access road serving the parcels of land on the north side of SR 122. SR 122 would continue as a four-lane divided roadway with a 20-foot raised


concrete median and rural 6 1/2-foot outside paved shoulders. The project would include a new bridge over I-75 and reconstruct the I-75 ramps. Approximately 0.7 miles of Morven Road (CR 782) would be relocated to intersect the reconstructed SR 122 to provide maximum median opening spacing with the proposed southbound ramps while minimizing impacts to the surrounding area. Approximately 0.7 miles of Union Road (CR 38) would be relocated to intersect the reconstructed SR 122 to provide maximum median opening spacing with the proposed northbound ramps while minimizing impacts to the surrounding area. The outside lanes on SR 122 would terminate at the relocated Union Road. SR 122 would continue as one lane in each direction separated by a variable flush median. The I-75/SR 122 interchange reconstruction on Main Street ends 1000 feet west of the intersection of Branch Street. The project would tie to the existing two-lane rural roadway. Existing right of way is 100 feet on SR 122, 60 to 80 feet on Morven and Union Roads and 300 to 600 feet within the I-75 interchange. Required right of way is 180 feet on SR 122, 80 feet on relocated Morven and Union Roads, and 300 to 750 feet within the I-75 interchange.




Project Location Map
