Project Description

IM-NH-75-1(227), Dooly County, PI No. 311665

The proposed project would reconstruct the I-75/SR 27 interchange by realigning 0.27 mile of SR 27 to accommodate the bridge replacement over I-75. The existing typical section of SR 27 consists of two 12-foot travel lanes with 8-foot grass shoulders on each side. The proposed typical section of SR 27 would include two 12-foot travel lanes with 4-foot paved shoulders and 6-foot grass shoulders. Right and left turn bays would be added to provide for traffic movements entering I-75. To accommodate these left turn lanes, a 24-foot raised median would be added along SR 27 crossing the bridge. The proposed typical section of the SR 27 bridge over I-75 would include two 12-foot lanes with 10-foot shoulders as well as a 24-foot raised median. The proposed typical section for the ramps include a 16-foot travel lane that widens to 24 feet to allow for a turn lane at the intersection. The project would also include the replacement of the northbound and southbound entrance ramps onto I-75 as well as add lighting to the interchange. Both northbound and southbound exit ramp termini will maintain the existing stop conditions along SR 27. Proposed right-of-way would vary from approximately 125 to 200 feet.

An approximate 0.6 mile realignment of CR 155 and the construction of 520 feet of pavement for the addition of a frontage road along SR 27 to give two operating gas stations adequate access would also be included. The intersection of SR 27 and CR 155 will be located approximately 660 feet from the proposed southbound exit ramps to avoid impacts to an adjacent stream which runs west of I-75. Additionally, CR 340 and CR 209 will be realigned so that their intersections with SR 27 are 1000 feet from the northbound ramps of I-75. Connector roads would be constructed for CR 340 and CR 209 to allow access to the existing alignments, which are to remain after construction is complete. Cul-de-sacs would also be added to the county roads near their present intersections with SR 27. The county roads, which would make up a new frontage road, would each consist of two 12-foot travel lanes with 4-foot unpaved shoulders.
