

A RESOLUTION BY THE STATE TRANSPORTATION BOARD OF GEORGIA 1991

T. HARVEY MATHIS PARKWAY — DESIGNATED.

WHEREAS, T. Harvey Mathis, one of Atlanta's outstanding business and civic leaders, died on June 7, 1991; and

WHEREAS, he was a native of Georgia and a graduate of Princeton University and the Harvard Business School and served for three years as an officer in the U.S. Navy; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Mathis and his firm, Taylor and Mathis, Inc., developed some of Atlanta's most successful commercial real estate properties, including Perimeter Center and Buckhead Plaza; and

WHEREAS, he served as a board member for several prominent Atlanta companies, as a director of the Atlanta Chamber of Commerce, and as president of the DeKalb Chamber of Commerce, and was chairman of the board of the Metropolitan Atlanta Olympic Games Authority; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Mathis was a steadfast supporter of transportation improvements and rendered invaluable assistance to the Department of Transportation in initiating the Georgia 400 extension project which is now under construction; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate that his accomplishments and service should be honored and remembered.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the section of State Route 400 now under construction from Interstate Highway 285 south to Interstate Highway 85 shall, when completed, be named the T. Harvey Mathis Parkway.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Commissioner of the Department of Transportation is authorized and directed to erect appropriate signing for this designation, that a copy of this resolution be entered in the records of this Board, and that a copy be presented to the Mathis family
