

A RESOLUTION BY THE STATE TRANSPORTATION BOARD OF GEORGIA 1996

HOWARD GILMAN HIGHWAY — DESIGNATED.

WHEREAS, Mr. Howard Gilman is one of Southeast Georgia's most successful manufacturers and has long endeavored to exert a positive influence in many fields on a local basis as well as globally; and

WHEREAS, he served our country as a naval intelligence officer during World War II, after which he came to St. Marys to work with his family's business, the Gilman Paper Company; and

WHEREAS, his company's role in Camden County includes not only providing over 2,500 jobs but also operating the White Oak Conservation Center which performs research in environmental restoration and wildlife preservation; and

WHEREAS, through the Howard Gilman Foundation he has been deeply involved in wildlife and environmental protection, medical research, and visual and performing arts throughout the world.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the segment of Interstate Highway 95 in Camden County be named the "Howard Gilman Highway."

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Commissioner of Transportation be instructed to place appropriate signs for this designation, that a copy of this resolution be spread upon the minutes of this meeting, and an appropriate copy be provided to Mr. Gilman.
