House Resolution 1040, Part a

Effective April 15, 1996

O. H. BANKS MEMORIAL BRIDGE — DESIGNATED.

A RESOLUTION

Amending a resolution approved March 4, 1964 (Ga. L. 1964, p. 247), designating the "O. H. Banks Bridge" so as to re-designate said bridge as the "O. H. Banks Memorial Bridge; and for other purposes.

WHEREAS, O. H. Banks was born September 6, 1900, in Shady Dale, Georgia; and

WHEREAS, he is widely recognized as a guiding force in the evolution of the banking industry in Georgia; and

WHEREAS, he was a highly capable businessman, farmer, and cattleman; a pioneer conservationist deeply interested in his community who served his fellow citizens as a member of the Board of Education of Jasper County for 23 years, 15 of which he served as chairman of the board; served as a member of the Jasper County Welfare Board for 26 years; served as a member of the City Council of Shady Dale for 44 years; and served as mayor of Shady Dale for 26 years; and

WHEREAS, Honorable E. Clyde Kelly, deceased, served as the Mayor of the City of Monticello, Georgia, and as Chairman of the Jasper County Board of Education; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Kelly served as Vice President of the First National Bank of Monticello; and

WHEREAS, he served as the Chairman of the Board of Stewards of the Methodist Church of Monticello; and

WHEREAS, during his lifetime, he was a respected citizen of Jasper County and was very active in civic affairs; and

WHEREAS, his counsel and advice were greatly valued by the citizens of Jasper County.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA, that the bridge on State Route 83 in Jasper County, over the Murder Creek, be named for Honorable O. H. Banks and re-designated as the "O. H. Banks Memorial Bridge."

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Department of Transportation is authorized and directed to place and maintain appropriate signs dedicating the road facility named in this Resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized and directed to transmit appropriate copies of this Resolution to the Department of Transportation and the family of O. H. Banks.

O. H. BANKS BRIDGE — DESIGNATED.

A RESOLUTION

Designating the O. H. Banks Bridge; and for other purposes.

WHEREAS, Honorable O. H. Banks is active in the civic and business affairs of Jasper County having served as the Mayor of the City of Shady Dale from 1941 through 1957 and from 1960 through 1964; as Vice Chairman of the Jasper County Board of Welfare from 1937 through 1963, and as a member of and as Chairman of the Jasper County Board of Education; and

WHEREAS, Honorable O. H. Banks is active in the religious, business and civic affairs of Jasper County having served as President of the Citizens Bank of Shady Dale and as a Deacon of the Providence Baptist Church; and

WHEREAS, he is respected and beloved by all those who know him; and

WHEREAS, he is active in political affairs of Jasper County; and

WHEREAS, his presence and participation in the political and business affairs of Jasper County greatly added in the economic growth of Jasper County; and

WHEREAS, it is only fit and proper that some memorial be designated to perpetuate his name.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA, that the bridge on State Route 83 in Jasper County, over the Murder Creek, be named for Honorable O. H. Banks and re-designated as the "O. H. Banks Memorial Bridge."

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the State Highway Department is authorized and directed to place and maintain appropriate signs dedicating the road facility named in this Resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized and directed to transmit appropriate copies of this Resolution to the State Highway Department, the family of the Honorable O. H. Banks, and the State Historical Commission.
