LOCODA TRAIL MEMORIAL PARKWAY — DESIGNATED.

No. 113 (House Resolution No. 292).

A RESOLUTION

Designating Georgia Highway 334 as the "Locoda Trail Memorial Parkway"; and for other purposes.

WHEREAS, the Locoda Trail was used by the Cherokee people and extended from what is now Athens-Clarke County through the present City of Commerce to the majestic north Georgia mountains; and

WHEREAS, this ancient trail was later followed by naturalist and explorer William Bartam in his famous travels through Georgia; and

WHEREAS, Georgia Highway 334 now follows what was once part of the Lacoda Trail and passes through historic community once known as Fort Groaning Rock; and

WHEREAS, it is fitting and proper that the name of said highway reflect the rich American heritage and memorialize the ancient Lacoda Trail.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA that Georgia Highway 334 in Jackson County from the junction of said highway with U.S. Highway 441 in the vicinity of the City of Commerce southward to its junction again with U.S. Highway 441 in the vicinity of the former Town of Center is designated as the "Lacoda Trail Memorial Parkway."

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Transportation is authorized and directed to erect and maintain appropriate signs so designating the parkway.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized and directed to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to the Department of Transportation.
