

GEORGIA SCENIC BYWAY BY THE GEORGIA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION 2011

COHUTTA – CHATTAHOOCHEE SCENIC BYWAY — DESIGNATED.

The Office of Planning at the Georgia Department of Transportation designated the Cohutta-Chattahoochee Scenic Byway.

Beginning at historic Prater's Mill in Whitfield County, the Cohutta-Chattahoochee Scenic Byway follows State Route 2 past rolling pastoral lands into Murray County.

Breathtaking views of the Cohutta Mountains emerge as the route continues along US 41 and quiet county roads into the Chattahoochee National Forest.

The 54-mile route skirts the town of Chatsworth before traveling up State Route 52, passing Fort Mountain State Park and ending at a beautiful mountaintop overlook.

Spurs off the route take visitors to the Cohutta Fish Hatchery and to a Forest Service camp site along Holly Creek.

The scenic 54-mile route in northwest Georgia, in Whitfield and Murray Counties:

- On Red Clay Road, from the Historic Prater's Mill, to Wilson Caldwell Road; then
- On Wilson Caldwell Road, to Stancil Road; then
- On Stancil Road, to Old Dalton-Cleveland Road; then
- On Old Dalton-Cleveland Road, to Hopewell Road; then
- On Hopewell Road, to Cohutta-Beaverdale Road; then
- On Cohutta-Beaverdale Road, to McGaughey Chapel Road; then
- On McGaughey Chapel Road, to Crow Road; then
- On Crow Road, to SR-2; then
- On SR-2, to SR-2/US-411 in Murray County; then
- On SR-2/US-411, to Summerour Road; then
- On Summerour Road, to Crandall-Ellijay Road; then
- On Crandall-Ellijay Road, to Old CCC Camp Road; then
- On Old CCC Camp Road, to Holly Creek-Cool Springs Road; then
- On Holly Creek-Cool Springs Road, to SR-52; then
- On SR-52, to a beautiful mountaintop overlook in Murray County.
